**HOUSING WITH SHRINE FAMILY**

\$800 per month/ \$8,000 per year  
 Includes transportation to school, three meals a day, a bed and quiet place to study. Lunches can be brought from home, however, if a student prefers to purchase lunch, they must pay for that. This assumes ten months from mid-Aug through mid-June.
